- Read verses 1-2. When Jesus returned to his own town, who met him? What did they want? What moved Jesus' heart? Why? What did Jesus say? What do his words teach us about the man? About the nature of sin? About Jesus?
- 2. Read verses 3-8. What was the response of the religious leaders? What did Jesus say? Why is criticism of Jesus evil? How did Jesus heal the man and demonstrate his authority to forgive sins? How did the crowds respond?
- 3. Read verses 9-10. Who was Matthew? What reveals him as a selfish sinner? What might his life as a tax collector be like?
- 4. What did Jesus say to him? What did this mean? How did he respond? Why? What shows his changed life and new joy?
- 5. Read verses 11-13. What did Jesus teach those who criticized him? Why? Read verses 14-17. How are Jesus' disciples different from the Pharisees? Why must they be? Explain the three metaphors Jesus used.
